Description of Experience: Sinai Hospital is an urban, community hospital with a 24 bed psychiatric unit. Average length of stay is 5 days and primary disease states encountered include psychotic disorders, mood disorders, and substance disorders. This rotation primarily focuses on the short-term management of psychiatric disorders in an acute-care setting, though care of patients transitioning to our outpatient and day hospital settings will also be addressed. Patient care is provided by interdisciplinary treatment teams consisting of psychiatrists, nurses, social workers, and pharmacists. Responsibilities include: treatment team meetings, patient interviews, medication management group therapy sessions in both the inpatient and outpatient settings, as well as civil commitment hearings and electroconvulsive therapy sessions as available.

The hematologic malignancy service is responsible for providing inpatient care for patients diagnosed with acute and chronic leukemias, myelodysplastic syndrome, Hodgkin's and Non-Hodgkin's lymphomas, and myeloma. These services may include induction, consolidation, or salvage chemotherapy as well as supportive care. The resident is responsible for attending daily rounds with the multidisciplinary team, which generally lasts 2-3 hours. The resident will check appropriateness of drug therapy for individual patients and make recommendations. Additionally, the resident is expected to be a drug information resource for the team. The resident will present disease and drug-related topics to the preceptor, which may be based on common malignancies seen in the unit, specific-patient issues, and drug therapy. The resident will also participate in patient education of chemotherapy regimens, adverse drug effects, and discharge medications. Residents may have other activities including pharmacy and nursing inservices or small projects.

Description of Experience: The Poison Center rotation is designed to help familiarize the resident/fellow with the process of obtaining, evaluating, and communicating information via telephone from patients, health professionals, and from medical and scientific literature. The resident/fellow will learn how to apply this information to the assessment, management and treatment of poisoning and overdose cases. The resident/fellow will develop a foundation in basic clinical toxicology, learn how to access and evaluate poisoning information from texts, computerized resources and primary literature, and develop an understanding of the core functions of a poison center.
